Author, Former Mayor of Nashville

Megan Barry is a former Mayor of Nashville and was the city's first female leader, a role in which she made significant strides in areas like transit, housing, and youth violence. Her tenure was cut short by personal and public challenges, which led to her resignation. After her time as mayor, Barry ran for Congress in Tennessee's 7th Congressional district.

In addition to her political career, Barry recently released her memoir, "It's What You Do Next," which details her complex journey through grief, personal scandal, and political leadership. The book reflects on the five transformative years of her life, exploring her relationship with her son Max, the aftermath of his death, and her efforts to rebuild her marriage with her husband, Bruce.

With over two decades of public service, Brenda has championed policies that prioritize women, children, and families, including securing Metro's first family leave policy and advocating for affordable housing, public education, and neighborhood safety. She is recognized for her leadership and commitment to building inclusive communities, having earned the Athena Award in 2019 and being named one of Nashville Business Journal's Women of Influence in 2020. Brenda's work reflects her belief that a strong community is built when every individual is invested in and supported.

Delishia Danielle Porterfield, a dedicated mother, educator, and social justice advocate, is serving her second term as Chair of the Budget and Finance Committee for the Metropolitan Nashville and Davidson County Council, overseeing a critical \$3.28 billion budget. A lifelong Tennessean raised in Memphis, Delishia's life experiences fueled her passion for public service. After studying at Howard University and Tennessee State University, she transitioned from public education to public office, making history as the first District Councilmember elected At-Large after just one term. Delishia has also served as Chair of the Education Committee, Vice-Chair of the Budget and Finance Committee, and Vice-Chair of the Minority Caucus, where she is the immediate past chair. She empowers progressive local leaders as a trainer with the Progressive Governance Academy and as the Co-Chair of the Black Caucus with Local Progress. A proud mother, Delishia shares her life in Nashville with her daughter and their rescue pets.

Gabby is a Representative, a dedicated scientist, and health care advocate with deep roots in Memphis, Tennessee. Rupa was born and raised in Tullahoma, TN. Upon graduation, she attended the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill where she graduated with a BA in Chemistry and a BA in History. She began her career in non-profit events in Los Angeles where she met her now husband and started her family. Rupa and her husband, Justin, decided to move to Tennessee in 2016 to be able to spend more time with their family. Upon moving back, she became active in local politics and community service. She has served on numerous boards and committees including the Tullahoma Fine Arts Center, Tullahoma Day Care Center, Coffee County Democratic Party, Tullahoma Planning Commission and Coffee County Library Board. In 2019, she was the first woman of color elected to Alderman. She served from 2019- 2022. She later was appointed to the State Executive Committee of the Tennessee Democratic Party, where she served from 2022- 2025. She was also an at-large delegate for President Biden at the 2020 Democratic National Convention as well as an at-large delegate for Vice President Kamala Harris at the 2024 Democratic National Convention. Rupa continues her career as a freelance event producer, but she is most focused on raising the next generation of

leaders as she parents 2 strong, willful, and bold children, Avery (12) and Jack (5).

Francie Hunt makes good trouble as an activist and organizer for progressive causes. She is the executive director of Tennessee Advocates for Planned Parenthood, which supports community organizing, civic engagement, and electoral programs statewide. She was the previous director of Stand for Children, a child advocacy organization, which helped successfully pass Tennessee's voluntary pre-kindergarten program impacting over 16,000 4-year olds and helped garner Race to the Top funding for Tennessee's public schools. She helped organize Women's Marches in Tennessee in January 2017, 2018, and 2019. After the overturn of Roe v. Wade, Francie walked 538 miles across Tennessee in pilgrimage and protest for bodily autonomy. Francie has served on the Nashville Public library board and Walk Bike Nashville. She is currently training to become a Buddhist meditation facilitator with Wild Heart Meditation Center. She is the mother of two young adults.



Erica Perry, Esq Executive Director Southern Committee Movement

Erica Perry is an organizer and movement lawyer from Nashville, Tennessee, dedicated to fighting for power with Black people and working-class communities in the US South. She has worked with advocates across Tennessee and nationwide, creating alternatives to police and jails, organizing for community-based investments, and building collective power.

A graduate of the University of Tennessee in Political Science and Public Administration, and the University of Memphis School of Law in 2016, Erica is licensed to practice law in Tennessee. In 2019, she co-founded the Black Nashville Assembly and Southern Movement Committee, focusing on participatory democracy, prison abolition, and youth organizing.

Erica co-founded the Black Lives Matter Memphis Chapter in 2015, where she led campaigns against money bail and pretrial detention, co-founded National Bail Out, and was a key figure in the Black Mama's Day Bail Out campaign. As Assistant Partnerships Director at Law for Black Lives, she provided legal and policy support to abolitionist movements and trained lawyers to support base-building organizations. Erica now serves as Executive Director of the Southern Movement Committee and is a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc.

She also mentors high school students in synthetic biology, leading a project on reducing livestock carbon emissions. In addition to her work in biotech, Jennifer advocates for women's representation through the Tennessee Women's Political Caucus and Elect Black Women PAC, focusing on voter registration, endorsements, and political training. Jennifer's commitment to leadership extends beyond science and into public service, working to ensure equal representation and inclusivity in every field. Jennifer earned her PhD in Neuroscience from the University of Alabama at Birmingham and a B.S. in Biomedical Engineering from the University of Tennessee. A Nashville native with a deep connection to local history, she enjoys gardening, theater, and fantasy novels.

Recipient of HRC Nashville's Equality Award, co-recipient of the Marisa Richmond Civic Advocacy Award from MTSU's LGBT-Plus Conference, & amp; a Nashville Pride Festival Grand Marshal. Dahron also works closely with the Southern Christian Coalition and East Nashtivists. In January 2024, when she offered the day's invocation on invitation from her state Representative Aftyn Behn, Chaplain Johnson became the first openly trans person to speak from the floor of the Tennessee House during session.
